Interior Architectural Services for a
corporate headquarters



The palpable energy of Cvent's new headquarters begins with its location over-looking the recently extended Metro System in Tysons Corner. The company specifically chose the location to be a part of the transformation and vitality of the changing Tysons area. The highly unique 80,000 square foot space spans two buildings, connected on three floors by a monumental stair, large employee lunchroom, and three conference/meeting rooms.

The entire three-floor space is designed to promote collaboration, social interaction, and creativity. The goal of the design was to create perpetual energy through interesting architectural geometries, angled walls, ceilings and details, natural light, and bold colors.



The three-story monumental stair connects all floors and serves as a unique sculptural element within the space. Created as both the functional and symbolic nexus between the buildings, floors, and individual spaces, it also serves as the anchor design feature within the space. One of the most unique design details is sequential, recessed floors along the monumental stair, creating negative space which is in-filled with glass. These glass niches along each of the three floor-lines create transparency from one floor to the next, while also creating dimension to the stair as a sculptural design element.



Wood ceiling slats are a repeated design feature in all collaboration areas, as well as the employee lunchrooms which connect the two buildings. In addition to being a thematic design feature, the warm wood juxtaposes the cool "techy" materials, such as metal, concrete and glass, utilized throughout most of the space.

Every turn throughout Cvent's headquarters creates a new, interesting, and exciting experience. It's no wonder they were voted by the Washington Post as one of 2014's Top 10 Places to work.
